

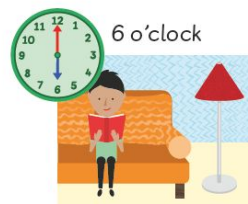

seventh



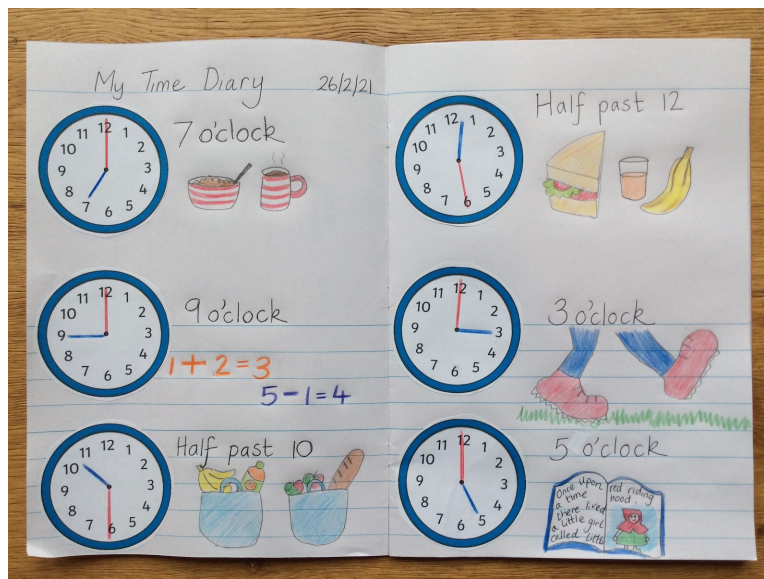
At half past eight at night,
